Beach Haven Borough Hall & Pine Shore Art Association “Beaches & Boats: then/now” Summer Art Show

BEACH HAVEN, NJ—The new exhibit “Beaches & Boats: then/now” in Beach Haven Borough Hall’s first floor art gallery presents 73 artworks on display through September 9. The show includes 61 paintings by 30 Pine Shores’ artists and 12 historic photos on loan from Cathleen Engelsen, Lawrence Oliphant, Beach Haven Library Museum, LBI Historical Society Museum, and Unshredded Nostalgia.

The show is open to visitors during Borough Hall hours, Monday – Friday, 9 am – 4 pm, and there will be a Saturday Open House on June 29 from 10 am – 4 pm as part of the LBI Art Studio Tour. There will also be an exhibit reception open to the public held in mid-August. A copy of the exhibit banner with background painting by Ada Barber is attached.
